VILLAGE "BUSINESS" CLOSED !

On Thursday, 2nd February the Police raided a **cannabis factory** in Church Gardens - thus ending this criminal enterprise. Our PCSO **Glyn Lewis** writes:-

"Since early November, a house in Church Gardens came to my attention. A small team of residents kept watch for me on all the activities resulting in simultaneous drug warrant raids on this house and one in Northampton. The house in Church Gardens was unoccupied but had been converted for growing a large number of cannabis plants. I must emphasise that the landlord had no Knowledge of this whatsoever. It took two large skips to clear the remains from the property and I also had to take 18 sacks of herbal residue for incineration. The Northampton address was even more productive with the arrest of eight foreign nationals and the recovery of approximately 18 kilos of ready for sale cannabis with a street value of over £140,000. For obvious reasons I cannot name the persons who fed me regular valuable information but they played as big a part as we, the police, did in this most successful operation. My thanks to those concerned".

ALICE FAULKNER – January 1919 to February 2012. An edited tribute by her daughter, Shirley Blakelock.

Mum was born in Castleford in Yorkshire, one of six children. When she left school, which she always said she didn't like, she went to work in London where her elder sister Jenny worked, looking after children.

She joined the Land Army in 1940 and was sent to Botany Farm, just off the West Haddon Road to work for Mr and Mrs Amos. I once asked her why the Land Army? The reply was it was either that or a factory and she didn't want to work in a factory. Dad was working at the farm and the rest as they say is history. They had six children who were brought up to look after one another. She worked hard to give us the best she could but was very strict at times. Mum never interfered in our lives but would always help, as more than one family member will remember, when they found themselves temporarily without a home.

I think one of the highlights of Mum's life was when her and her Dad went on holiday to Scotland with Uncle Tom and auntie Doff in the early 70's. Sadly my Dad died in 1978 and Mum lived on her own for many years. She used to spend time with the family some weekends and would always shout the answers when we played quizzes to cries of "Oh Nan!".Her favourite pastimes were reading, shopping, playing patience and jigsaw puzzles.

In 2003 she had a heart attack and developed dementia. She went to live at Boniface Care Home where she was looked after with great care and understanding. I think our lasting memory of her will be her 93rd birthday when we had a cup of tea with her at Boniface and she was full of life and really happy.
