Spring has sprung!



As Spring bursts into life all around us, we are reminded that change and growth is part of life.

No sooner have we said 'Goodbye' to Revd Andrew Taylor-Cook and seen him

licensed to his new post in the Denby group of parishes, than we are saying 'Hello' to Revd Dr Linnet Smith who has moved into Spratton to take up the post of Associate Priest.

Linnet comes to us with a teaching background, and extensive leadership experience in the church as a lay person, followed by being curate at Oundle and parish priest of three parishes on the edge of Norwich. Together with Revd Dr Judy Craig Peck she will be part of a gifted leadership team of lay and ordained people for our Uplands group of parishes.

As I write this we are preparing for Ascension Day next week, and Pentecost (or Whit Sunday) shortly afterwards. Ascension Day was a 'Good bye' for the followers of Jesus. They had just got used to Jesus being alive, raised from the dead, actually among them and not a ghost, when he says a final 'Good bye' and disappears from their sight. However, his 'Good bye' was a preparation for a different sort of 'Hello'. The coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost made it possible for anyone, anywhere across the world, to welcome Jesus into their lives.

If I had a pound for everyone who has said to me over the past few weeks: 'Well, you won't see me in church, but I do as much as I can for the community', I would be a rich man. This period in the church's year reminds us that what lies at the heart of Christian faith is not how much good we do or don't do, not whether we go to church or not, but whether we have a relationship with Jesus Christ, with Jesus at the centre of our life.

I am passionate about the church; I am passionate about people working for the good of our community; but I am even more passionate about each person experiencing the joy that a relationship with the living, risen Lord Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit, can bring. This is not just something for 'spiritual' people, or 'good' people or people who enjoy church services.

This is God's invitation to you, inviting you to respond in your unique, individual way to God's claim on your life. *Chris Peck*
