CRIB FIGURES RESTORED

ST DENYS CHURCH has a wonderful set of crib Figures which are unique in quality and size. They have been in our church for over 45 years and inevitably suffered some knocks and deterioration over time.

Dennis Patrick organised their restoration which has been carried out by Barbara Wykes, a sculptress and chief designer at Haddonstone in East Haddon. This work, which has restored the figures to their former glory, has been generously arried out without any charge. The Parochial Church Council and, we trust, all the Parish are very grateful.

The figure of the Christ Child was presented by the Ravensthorpe Mother's Union led by Mrs Beatrice Rice, sister of the then vicar Reverend Chew. The choir, which then numbered 30 villagers, raised the money for the figures of Mary and Joseph. The figure of the Angel was given by Mr and Mrs Ivan Smith, parents of Nigel Smith.

The late Commander and Mrs Pasley-Tyler gave the figures of the Ox and the Ass.

All these figures were made in Italy. At one time there were also two sheep made with white fur by Mrs Ivan Smith but sadly these have not survived.


As some of you may know, Jack Davies, former Lord of the Manor of Ravensthorpe has sadly passed away and his title has been vacant untl now. Charles is the new Lord of the Manor of Ravensthorpe.

There cannot be many villagers who haven't bumped into Charles, although most of them will know him as "Charlie."

Charles' parents, Tom and Pauline owned a building firm in Coventry and began building work in Ravensthorpe with their own home in the High Street, moving here in 1961 with Charles and his younger brother Simon.

When they left school both Charles and Simon joined the family firm and over the years they built more homes in the village including many along the Guilsborough Road and Little Lane, as well as the whole of Scott Close.

In 1972 Charles married Yvonne and they moved into Scott Close and in 1982

In 1983 Tom died. A few years after Tom's death Simon and Shona moved to Australia with their family. Charles then decided not to continue their building firm on his own. The last two houses he built are at the bottom of Little Lane, next to the Post Office, in what had once been their builder's yard!

THIS is a local campaign aimed at getting East Haddon telephone **Broadband** enabled. The exchange supplies East Haddon, Great Brington, Little Brington, Holdenby and Ravensthorpe.

Broadband gives you a high-speed connection to the internet that is "always on." Whether used for business or leisure, it enables you to:

- Talk and surf at the same time
- Instantly access the internet whenever you like
- Stay in touch at all times
- Send and receive attachments more easily
- View web contents up to 10 times faster than before

It will cost BT in the region of £250,000 to upgrade our exchange, BT has set a trigger level of 200 households to show their interest in Broadband and so far 156 have registered. It is important to remember that by giving your details, you are not committing yourselves to anything, only showing your interest.

THREE YEARS AGO the Newsletter featured an article on the Post Office and Shop. However many newcomers to the village may not be aware of the many services provided. The recent closure of the shop and post office in Guilsborough has highlighted the importance of supporting this valuable asset in the village.

The shop is open from 6.00am to 6.00pm Monday to Friday and 6.00am to 1.00pm on Saturday and Sunday. Newspapers are delivered daily. Freshly baked bread is available from 6.00am and fresh free-range eggs. Dry cleaning and shoe repairs are also arranged.

Post Office services include a banking service with Barclays, Lloyds TSB, Alliance & Leicester, and the Co-Op (with Cahoot Internet) providing cheque cashing and deposits. We encourage the use of the Post Office Card Account for receiving pensions. Please use this service in conjunction with one of the participating banks. Most bills can be paid through Post Office Ltd., without charge.

Barbara Glossop has retired from working part-time in the shop after five years and David McDermott wishes to express his gratititude to her. She will be missed.

Janet Reader will be taking Barbara's place and David's father Alec is also helping out.
