FROM MR BEVAN'S SETASIDE LAND WALKING ACCESS TO RESERVOIR


ANGLIA WATER are happy for walkers to have **ONE** access to the Reservoir from Top Ardles Wood.

Crime Report at Parish Meeting

Glynn Lewis our local PCSO reported on the crime situation in Ravensthorpe over the past year. 13 crimes were recorded as opposed to 12 the year before.

The most vulnerable people to burglary are old people who are believed by thieves to have high amounts of cash in their homes

Four-wheel-drive vehicles are also targeted and, in most cases, they are taken when keys are left in when unoccupied.

Car keys are also stolen when left visible inside houses. Houses with alarms are least likely to be broken into. There are fewer officers in the western area of the county, as many have been transfered to fight crime in Northampton town. This makes it more important for everyone to take precautions and be vigilant. In addition to the police, Neighbourhood Watch and Farm Watch are there to help.
