A QUARTER CENTURY ON

IN 1979 I had been running the Village Agency for about two to three years when I decided that I was in need of a new direction.

This presented itself one lunchtime when en route to have lunch with my mother, then living at "Shangri-la," I stopped in for fuel at the Garage and started talking with the then owner, Roy Atkinson.

Roy said "Peter, I'm thinking of retiring and what I would like is a bungalow in the village just like your mother's, next door."

Over lunch I discussed the prospect with mother and that afternoon I called back round to see Roy and a deal was agreed. Roy would buy the bungalow next door and I would buy the Garage and the white cottage at the other side of the forecourt, known as The Old Woolpack.

So mother and Geoff Wykes (who now manages the Garage), moved into the old white cottage for six months whilst a new house was being built for them in East Haddon. I continued living over the Village Agency and Geoff took up the reins at the Garage in my absence.

Some six months later Mother and Geoff moved to East Haddon and Teddy and I moved into The Old Woolpack. After some years of gentle persuasion, Teddy and I were married in 1984. Our first daughter, Sophie, was born in 1992 and some two-and-a-half years later, our second daughter Rebecca arrived. Now with the family up to four we had outgrown The Old Woolpack and so we set about the task of building the new

Over the years of owning and running the Garage, we have had a relatively small number of staff working here, but there have been some great characters and in amongst the serious business of working there have been many moments of drama and amusement. During this time, we have had six young men/school leavers join the Garage as apprentices who have sometimes had to start running to keep up with life's learning curves! Most have moved on successfully either in the car business or similar.

Although I have been away on numerous occasions with other interests, I have always enjoyed coming back to the Garage with its great atmosphere and some wonderful customers who have been a pleasure to work with for all these years. With almost a quarter of a century passed like lightning, I wish to say "thank you" for all those who have made running the Garage a great experience and pleasure.
