THE LICENSING of the Reverend John Tarrant as Priestin-Charge of St Deny's, Ravensthorpe and the Reverend Karen Jongman as NSM Curate by the Right Reverend Frank White, Bishop of Brixworth took place on Wednesday evening, 10th September.


At the end of this year John Tarrant will be celebrating 40 years of ordination. His first position was as curate at Chelsea Old Church in London. He then served as chaplin at St Peter's College, Birmingham. By coincidence the principal of the College was Canon Platten, the father of Meg Benn, our churchwarden.

John Tarrant then became the first Anglican priest in the newly constructed capital of Belize at Belmorpan. For four years he shared an ecumenical ministry with Catholics and Methodists.

On returning to England he became vicar of a church in Sussex, near Ashdown Forest and then went to Ringwood in the New Forest. He then served with the Team Ministry based in Ross-on-Wye and took services in 30 out of 35 churches in that Deanery.

As Reverend John and his wife Madeleine's children were all located between London and Cornwall, he looked for a ministry south of the A14.

On becoming the Vicar of Guilsborough three years ago he luckily just managed this. It is a result of John Tarrant's active support that Ravensthorpe and Coton have become part

Alice Mold Born 26TH June 1905

A tribute by her grandson, Colin Mold

Alice moved to Home Farm, Ravensthorpe (now the home of Richard Fowler and family) in the 1930's and farmed 120 acres with her husband Edward Cecil Mold.

They farmed mostly dairy cattle with some arable and grass to feed their herd of Friesian cattle. After retiring in 1965, and handing the farm over to their son Ronnie, Alice and Edward moved to East Farndon, then Lorraine Drive. Northampton and finally to Stannard Way in Brixworth.

Alice's husband Edward died in 1978. Alice remained in Stannard Way until the late 1990's. She first moved to Boniface House and then to Pytchley Court in Brixworth where she was tenderly cared for until her death on 1st September 2003, at a grand age of 98.

Alice was laid to rest with her husband Ravensthorpe Churchvard.
