## THE MINERAL PLAN INQUIRY

THE HEARING into the proposed gravel quarry at Lodge Farm, West Haddon took place on Tuesday 19th April. At the outset it was learned that Anglia Water had withdrawn their objections subject to the following conditions:

No on-site processing plant. No dewatering.

No landfill and the restoration of drainage to the small wet land area.

These conditions will adversely effect the economic viabilty of the site.

In the morning session Councillor Miller and Mr Wood of Daventry District Council raised their objections to the site and amongst other matters expressed their discomfort that the Northamptonshire County Council wanted environmental issues left to the planning stage.

The speakers in the afternoon were the Reverend Clive Evans, Martin Wilkes, Helen Nottingham and John Wallace on behalf of RAGE, David Herbert for himself and John Matts, chairman of Ravensthorpe Parish Council.

They presented a very professional case to the Inspector who praised them for their in-depth research and the manner of their presentation. It was a very impressive effort.

Finally the inquiry heard from Mr Bower of the Cornach Trust, representing the De Nobrigas of Coton Lodge.

The Inquiry Team was well supported by a large team from Ravensthorpe, West Haddon, Guilsborough and Long Buckby and our thanks go to these people who have given up many, many hours of their spare time and spent their own money to build a case against Northamptonshire County Council who have spent many hundreds of thousands of pounds to defend their position.

Thanks should also go to those, including our Vicar and his wife Madelaine who attended the Inquiry to support the team.

We will not know the Inspector's findings for some time, but regardless of the outcome it is suggested that Parish and Daventry Councils need to monitor and promptly respond to developments in the run-up to the next Mineral Plan. This will be a combined Waste and Mineral Plan, taking effect in only three years' time.

However, the Consultation Period starts shortly and the County Council has published a document giving details, including a timetable for the various stages.


