## The Reverend Glenn Martin

On Monday, 3rd September, Bishop Ian licensed the Reverend Glenn Martin to act as Assistant Priest for all eight parishes in the Guilsborough Group. He and his wife Sally will move to Spratton at the end of September on a house for duty basis. They were to have moved earlier but Glenn broke his ankle which has delayed matters somewhat.

Glenn was born and brought up in Warwickshire and at the age of 20 he joined the Church Army doing his training at Blackheath, London.

In 1975 he was commissioned as a captain by the then Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr Coggan. Glenn served for six years working mostly in hostels with drug addicts, alcoholics, the homeless and

the mentally ill.

At 27 he qualified as a psychiatric nurse and worked in the mental health department of the NHS.

He was ordained in 1986 and was a curate for 3 years in Rochester. He then became a Hospital Chaplain for hospitals in Derby and Sheffield.

In 2003 Glenn came to the North Kilworth group of parishes as Associate Priest on a part-time basis, while continuing his work with the NHS.

His wife, Sally, is a Minister in the United Reform Church and will continue to work full-time as a Chaplain in the NHS in Leicestershire.

We look forward to welcoming them to our community.


# The Way We Were

Brought up in an orphanage, Charlie had had a miserable upbringing, so we decided to get married straightaway and St Matthews Day (21st September 1946) saw us in the village church with just one of his brothers and all my family around us.

I had a full length crepe dress with a borrowed veil and headress of orange blossom. My bouquet was made up of ferns and pink carnations. Charlie wore a navy suit - the first he had ever possessed. There were two adult bridesmaids, Mirrie and Jean who did not hold the box incident against me! Their dresses were pink and my nephew Dennis Patrick and my neice Barbara (now Barbara Glossop) wore blue and completed the wedding as a pageboy and a little bridesmaid.

Back then it was customery to give a rolling pin to the bride as she came out of church. Sixty years later I am still using mine! The reception was of course in the Village Hall with delicious homemade food. Everything was perfect, except I really wanted a three-tier wedding cake, but the food rations would not run to it!



Our first journey as a married couple was at the end of the reception when we were whisked off to Long Buckby by taxi, a novel experience for us both! We took a train down to Epping and spent our honeymoon there - a far cry from the exotic destinations young couples visit nowadays.

A week later we were back and living with my parents on The Green. We stayed there for about two years, until we got our own home in Hollowell. Six years later we were back in Ravensthorpe. We moved into our present home in Teeton Road, where we have lived happily together ever since
