## **EDITORIAL** by John Mott

#### **TOXOCARIASIS**

I do not like writing about dog-fouling but it continues to be serious and a potentially dangerous problem. Last month I reported fouling on the church path and in the churchyard. Now I have been informed of fouling in the **Playing field**. The suspect is one large dog and its irresponsible owner.

All puppies and dogs are carriers of toxocariasis which is present in their faeces. This can infect humans and lead to blindness. Children are most at risk as they are more likely to place their hands on the ground or handle toys which have made contact with a dog mess.

There is no danger to the dog owner who cleans up the mess in good time as the infection takes a while to develop. Bag it and take it home, washing your hands after disposal. Throwing a bagged mess into a hedgerow or suchlike is totally unacceptable.

The Playing Field in particular must be kept free of dog fouling. Legislation under the Dog's Act provides for a fine of £1,000 for dog fouling on public land and rights-of-way.

Consideration should be given to placing warning signs and clearly marking bins at entrances and around the Playing Fields.
