Message from Reverend Chris Peck, rector of the Uplands Group of Parishes:

Having said goodbye to Linnet in October, I am very pleased to announce that our new Associate Priest is to be

Revd Allison Twigg. Allison comes highly recommended; she is currently the Assistant Curate at St Peter's, Weston Favell. She has been a teacher, assistant head and school governor, and has done much to develop work with families in Weston Favell. Allison will be licensed at St Andrews, Spratton by Bishop John at 3.00pm on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> April and I hope as many as possible will want to be there to welcome her. Allison will be working from Spratton Vicarage until August when she and her family – husband Matthew and children Megan and Edward – will move into the Vicarage.

Allison will be full time; I shall remain as Rector but shift to being half time. All the clergy will continue to lead worship across the Uplands Group, with Allison having a particular administrative and pastoral focus on Cottesbrooke, Creaton, Guilsborough, Hollowell and Spratton with myself focusing on Cold Asbhy, Ravensthorpe and Thornby. With this appointment, I am very hopeful for the continuing life of the Uplands Churches into the future. So over to Allison to say, "Hello"



Hello. I am very excited about making the move to the Uplands Churches at the end of April. Following a career in Primary education, theological training at Ripon College, Cuddesdon, I was ordained in 2015 and am currently serving my curacy in the parish of St Peter's, Wes-
