I am delighted to be able to let you know about our plans for reopening some of the church buildings for public worship from the beginning of August. Cottesbrooke are not ready to re-open at this time and plan to re-assess this in the Autumn.

The situation demands some changes to our worship space, to the pattern and content of our worship, and also requires a number of things of worshippers themselves, so please read the fuller "What to Expect" information page very carefully. This will be linked to the circulated email.

In short, worship will be a little different and the number of services reduced for the foreseeable future. You will also need to bring a completed data form (also linked to the circulated email,) with you the first time you return to the church building. Obviously, this is something of a voyage into the unknown, we will be in touch with you should there be any problem with opening.

We intend to continue broadcasting services each week, at least until the end of the pandemic, and very probably beyond. As we do not have reliable internet connection in our churches this will continue to be broadcast from the homes of the clergy.

Please don't feel that you must return to church straight away. Only do so when you are ready and comfortable to come back. Worship continues wherever you are through the internet or telephone broadcasts. It is important that you do not come to church if you feel unwell, especially if you have the symptoms of Covid-19, such as a temperature, a cough, or you have lost your sense of taste or smell.

For those of you who do not feel able to return yet, please know that the whole church community continues to pray for you. You will not be forgotten as services resume in church. If you need contact or prayer, please don't hesitate to contact me.

Children's Play Area

The Children's Play Area is now open, but we ask you to follow guidelines for minimising the transmission risk for Covid-19.

The Playground equipment is shared equipment and is used at your own risk.

- We recommend you bring suitable anti-bacterial wipes to wipe down equipment where appropriate;
- Do not take food and drink into the play area;
- If you are wearing disposable PPE or using tissues or wipes, please take them home with you. Do not litter.
- Wash your hands as soon as you get home.
- Parents: if you or your children are not feeling well in any way, please do not visit the Play Area.
