St Denys Churchyard:

The PCC in Raventhorpe is charged with ensuring that the Churchyard stays as a timeless, natural and peaceful place for all users of the area. To enable this we are required to stay in compliance with the Churchyard Regulations. Sadly this doesn't allow the addition of ornaments and keepsakes to grave areas, or artificial flowers (except in certain circumstances – see below).

Whilst we try to be as understanding as we can in the circumstances, especially with regard to new graves, we do intend to carry out a tidy up of the churchyard at the end of May, and may need to remove certain items that are not in compliance with the rules, so we would respectfully request that if relatives wish to remove and keep any of these items, that they do so by the end of the month.

Section 5.2 of the rules says: "Wreaths and other cut flowers may be laid on a grave, but must be removed as soon as they appear to be withered. No artificial flowers are allowed to be laid or placed in containers except for Remembrance Day poppies and

traditional Christmas wreaths. These must be removed after a period of not more than two months. Flower bulbs may be planted in the soil of any grave. No tree, rose bush or other shrub may be planted to mark a place of interment without the authority of a faculty." The PCC would like to thank you for your assistance in helping them in this matter.

Pocket Park update: Hedges, Hawthorn and Heralds.

Recently, we've been working on the hedgerows, principally in the lane, by planting saplings in the hedgerow gaps, trimming and laying the hedge in the meadow. A healthy hedge is good for wildlife and plays an important role in preventing pollution, flooding and soil loss. It also provides a home for pollinators. We're promoting the importance of

hedges as part of the Action on Climate Change grant from the former Daventry District Council.

Hawthorn, also known as May, is probably the commonest hedgerow shrub. It can turn our hedges into a bridal bloom of white. They provide food for more than 150 different insect species, so are very valuable for wildlife. For hedges to provide these benefits, cut/trim them less frequently, allowing them to gain an adequate height. And of course thickness too for nesting birds.

Flying insects, such as moths and cockchafers, feed bats like noctules who visit the pocket park frequently. They could be living in the cracks and cavities of our tall ash trees. Landowners could support wildlife by having more trees in our hedgerows.

Through the grant, we've planted buckthom into the hedges to provide more diversity, also food for Brimstone butterfly caterpillars. In May, they'll be laying eggs on plants in a sunny sheltered location. Fingers crossed, we're hoping to see an increase of these heralds of Spring in the village in future years.
