CRABTREE PIT POCKET PARK

Pocket Park update:

The cowslips are stunning again. Soon the ox-eye daisies will add white to the blanket of yellow during May, increasing to reds, purples and blues later in the year.

Please note that we'll be reseeding the bare patches on the grass path in the lane. The park will remain open but you may be guided away from these places.

Work on a hibernaculum and bee bank has started at the far end of the park beyond the pond. A hibernaculum creates an environment for reptiles and amphibians to safely overwinter. The bee bank will hopefully provide a place for solitary bees to tunnel providing a secure place to lay their eggs.

Mining bees are one group of over 250 species of solitary bees in the uk. Solitary bees don't live in a colony, so no queen, no workers and no hive to protect. Our village's sandy soils, sandstone houses and cob walls make Ravensthorpe a fabulous place for them and the species that depend on

Please can I remind villagers, no pond dipping at the park. The best places are Cotton Park and Mill Reserve Long Buckby. We've tested both, they're fabulous ponds. At the latter you can even hire their study centre and equipment.
