# QUEEN'S POLICE MEDAL FOR IAN McDONALD

One of "Ravensthorpe's own", PC Ian McDonald has been awarded a Queen's Police Medal in the Queen's Birthday Honours list, in recognition of his work as a police dog handler for Northamptonshire Police. Ian, Caroline and family have lived in Ravensthorpe since 2006.

Ian joined the Northamptonshire Police in 2000, moving into a proadive team in 2001 and then into CID as a qualified detective. 


