HORACE BATTEN - Part 5, conclusion

Apart from work, Horace was a District Councillor on the old Brixworth Rural District Council until it was replaced by the Daventry DC. With his late wife, Barbara, he was involved in many notable village events. Barbara was an expert in flower decoration and appeared on a number of TV programmes and was responsible for flower festivals at St. Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey and St. Giles in Edinburgh. She also served on the Chelsea Flower Show Council. Horace and Barbara were the key movers in the two Wool Festivals that raised so much money for St. Denys' Church and other village organisations. If the village considered another Wool Festival, Horace has the two coats that were previously created for use as a guide. (As mentioned above they will be displayed on the Village Open Day.)

At the age of 97 Horace has passed the business, which is still going strong, into the hands of his son Tim and his granddaughter Emma. They have expanded the business, installed new machinery and now make the wooden "trees" that go into the boots. However, Horace is still going into work each day and is very much involved, particularly with the essential skill of pattern cutting. Tim and Emma also have the benefit of his 80 years experience and practical advice.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH 2010
