

The Academy Award winner writer Graham Moore (The Imitation Game) has co-written and directed The Outfit, a gripping crime thriller in which a tailor (Academy Award winner Mark Rylance (Bridge of Spies, Wolf Hall)) finds himself in the middle of a deadly war between rival Chicago mobsters.

### Gender is on the agenda

It's the time of year for trees to start to flower. Many typical plants, as you'll remember from school biology days, have male and female parts within one flower, anthers and stigma. However, many people aren't aware that some plants like nettles, and trees such as holly, yew, black popular and ash\* are 'dioecious' i.e trees have either male flowers or female flowers. Also some trees have male and female flower parts that are on separate places on the same tree. These are known as 'monoecious'. For example, in hazels the male flowers are catkins releasing pollen in the wind and the female flowers are tiny red like sea anemones on the twigs and branches. Other trees that are similar are alder, oak, beech, and birch.
