

TUESDAY 6th JUNE 7.00 for 7.30: MAINSTREAM FILM PHANTOM OF THE OPEN

"Phantom of the Open", directed by Craig Roberts (Dreamhorse), tells the remarkable, true story of Marcus Flitcroft, a crane operator and optimistic dreamer from Barrow in-Furness who, with the support of family and friends, managed to gain entry to the 1976 British Open despite never having played a round of golf before.



While drawing the ire of the golfing elite, Flitcroft's fearless ineptitude on the fainway struck a chord among the non-country-club rank and file and captured the imagination of sports page editors and the public. Flitcroft is utterly sincere and charmingly ridiculous. That he would pull off return appearances at the British Open in various guises — once using the name Arnold Palmtree — is one of the delights of his story.

Flitcroft is played by Mark Rylance as an eccentric holy innocent; his longsuffering and affectionate wife is played by Sally Hawkins; and Rhys Ifans is the pop-eyed, pompous club secretary. The screenplay is adapted by Simon Famaby from the 2010 non-fiction book he co-wrote with Scott Murray and shares the good naturedness that runs through Farnaby's Paddington 2.
