### TOP ARDLES WOOD

From Matt George, Site Manager.

The woodland, rides and meadow area are developing well at Top Ardles and the trees are at the age now where management interventions will be beneficial in improving the biodiversity and long-term health of the site.

The central section of woodland, predominantly composed of willows and hazel, is now at a suitable size for bringing into a cyclical coppice scheme. This is a traditional method of woodland management that involves cyclically cutting the stems down to almost ground level and letting them regrow. As well as producing a more-sustainable supply of timber, coppicing also benefits the woodland wildlife by creating a variety of different structures and conditions. This allows more light to reach the ground in rotation, increasing the diversity and abundance of wildflowers.

The majority of the hazel will be coppiced in sections over the next 3 years and then each section will likely be cut again on a 7-12 year cycle. The willow section is currently being coppiced around the outside of the area to prevent the stems from splitting out and causing a safety concern for path users. After which, it will then be coppiced regularly. The resulting regrowth will hopefully be suitable to be use for products like weaved baskets.

To return this central area back into management, we are working with a local coppice group called The Whittlewood Concept (website link below). Their vision is to promote these traditional woodland management techniques, making them once again viable for future generations whilst protecting the local ecology and environment, increasing biodiversity and creating suitable habitats for all manner of wildlife. The products they harvest may be used for stakes and binders in hedge-laying, spars for thatching and sustainably-sourced charcoal and biochar, amongst others.

Currently, The Whittlewood Concept will be using and selling what they produce. However, this will be an evolving situation and in the future we hope to get more local people involved in the management of the wood so they too can benefit from the produce, such as hazel bean poles and willow for weaving. The Whittlewood Concept will start coppicing in late winter 23/24, when some of the material will be harvested. I'm excited to say that they will then return in April/May with their low-impact retort kiln (trailer mounted and that recycles waste gases) to produce available and sustainable charcoal at Top Ardles Wood. I'll announce the date nearer the time. Please do visit them when on site to discuss their processes and products.

Please do get in touch with myself, if you are interested in volunteering in the woodland in the future and in using potential produce.
