

Mainstream Tuesday 7th November: 7.30pm Doors Open 7.00pm: The Unlikely Pilgrimage of Harold Fry:

Harold Fry (Jim Broadbent) is an unremarkable retiree whose uneventful marriage to Margaret (Penelope Wilton) is blighted by a conflict relating to their absent son. When Harold leams that an old friend, Queenie, is terminally ill he is dissatisfied with trying to express his feelings in a letter of condolence. Instead of sending it he decides in a spontaneous and secular act of faith that if he walks from his home in Devon to Berwick-upon-Tweed, where Queenie is receiving palliative care in a hospice, he can save her life - leaving his wife hurt and confused by her husband's abandonment.

During his long walk he encounters acts of kindness and also comes to terms with troubling past events, taking on a beatific lightness, and the simple nature of his quest draws followers who hope to find answers to their own sorrows by joining this scraggly south coast Jesus.

The story of this walk is taken from the popular, critically acclaimed and multi-award winning, sad and quirky book by Rachel Joyce who also wrote the screenplay for this film by Hettie Macdonald (director of TV's Normal People).

In Pedro Almodóvar's 'Pain and Glory' - which is fictional but partially autobiographical - Antonio Banderas plays Salvador Mallo, an aging film-director experiencing illness and creative block. He is invited to a 30th anniversary screening of his '80s hit 'Sabor' following which he attempts to reconcile himself with his past. He sifts through his life in a more vibrant past as a series of flashbacks to old relationships and memories that shaped his life, including his childhood devotion to his mother, Jacinta (Penélope Cruz), his first boyish crush, his first mature relationship with a genuine lover, and the forces that allowed him to define himself through the world of cinema.

Vivid, reflective and touching, the memories charge the fading director with a renewed self-respect and hope.

#### COMMUNITY BUS SERVICE FROM RAVENSTHORPE TO DAVENTRY OR RUGBY/ELLIOTT'S FIELD.

Household Support Fund

WNC has been allocated £5.2million for residents who are working and are on a low wage. To be eligible residents must be in full or part-time work earning less than £400 a week after tax, including any government benefits. Also have less than £5000 in household money, saving and investments, and not have received government cost of living payments. Please search for Household Support Fund on the Went Northants Council website if you think you may qualify. Payments of up to £300 are available.

#### Parking on Pavements
