4th Feb - last woodland work before nesting season



As we know, (and according to Keep Britain Tidy) "dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous", and is related to serious infections. Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be fined for up to £1,000.

In Ravensthorpe, it is not policed (as such) and we rely on dog-owners' common sense and their sense of responsibility for others' welfare. 
