### The Playing Field Lottery year starts in June: please support it

The new lottery year is coming around soon! In May we shall be selling tickets for the new year that commences in June. An annual ticket is £15.

We would like to remind all villagers that the Playing Field does not receive any public funding for its upkeep—it is NOT a public park, contrary to popular belief and relies entirely on funds raised through the lottery and events. Our aim is to sell a minimum of 200 tickets each year, and the income from this goes a long way to covering the costs of the grass cutting of the field and the Children's Play Area. Currently, approximately 50% of the households in the village, support the Playing Field by buying a ticket, and many of those buy two or more. For that the village is most grateful. But we would like to encourage everyone to buy a ticket, if you can, especially if you use the Playing Field for dog-walking and your family / children use the facility for playing and other recreation. The Playing Field is there only through the generosity of the villagers who originally bought the land in 1946-8 as a memorial to the villagers who died in the war, and those who have supported it since.





## COMMUNITY BUS SERVICE FROM RAVENSTHORPE TO DAVENTRY OR RUGBY/ELLIOTT'S FIELD.

There are some minor changes.

The Tuesday bus from West Haddon to Daventry via Guilsborough, Coton and Long Buckby is now a service bus -No 52. It will pick up in Ravensthorpe at the bus shelter and at the bottom of the West Haddon Rd at 9.45. It will run every Tuesday. You do still have to be registered to use the service as our village stops are request only.

The Haddon Hopper will run to Rugby (Elliott's Field or town centre) on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April and Thursday 23<sup>th</sup> May. On Thurs 30<sup>th</sup> May there will be a trip to Corby-Pick-up starts at 9.30am.

For all trips the bus returns after approximately 2 hours. This service is run by a social enterprise - CommMiniBus and administered by volunteers.

The service is free to anyone with a bus pass, it costs £2 per single journey for anyone without a pass. Passengers need to register to use the service - ring 0333 188 0591 or email bookings@cmbus.org. You must also book for each trip.
