# Survey of Heavy Goods Vehicles Passing through the Village

The number and size of the HGVs using Ravensthorpe as a through route is a common gripe from residents – particularly from those who live on the High St or use it as a walking route. Also, we have narrow roads leading in and out of the village which are not suitable for large heavy lorries.

Some HGVs will inevitably use the village roads as they are delivering locally, but the Parish Council feels that satnavs and routing systems are increasingly using our roads to save a bit of time, at the expense of the fabric of our village and the safety of people and animals. West Northants Council tell us that the opening of the Northern relief bypass will enable them to revise weight limits and guidance.

We feel that we need to have some data on the amount of this sort of traffic, and the routes being used through the village, so that we can compare it with data at some point in the future when mitigating action has been taken.

So, I am seeking **volunteers** to take slots of 2 hours at a time, sitting at the bottom of the West Haddon Road on the Green and recording the route being taken and the type of lorry. If there are enough volunteers, working in pairs, I would hope to do 2 different days in successive weeks. Time slots would be by agreement, recording materials and instructions will be provided; if anyone has a small gazebo they could lend us, to cover 2 people sitting at a table, that will be very welcome in case it is very sunny or wet!

## COMMUNITY BUS SERVICE FROM RAVENSTHORPE TO DAVENTRY OR RUGBY/ELLIOTT'S FIELD.
