The Cowslips will soon be brightening up the meadow with their clusters of bright yellow, bell shaped flowers on upright stems. Did you know they are the county flower for Northamptonshire? They are a relation of the primrose and are associated with English folklore and traditions such as adorning Mayday garlands and being strewn across church paths for weddings. Cowslips are an important early source of nectar for insects including bees, beetles and butterflies such as the Brimstone.

COMMUNITY BUS SERVICE FROM RAVENSTHORPE TO DAVENTRY OR RUGBY/ELLIOTT'S FIELD.

Every Tuesday: West Haddon to Daventry via Guilsborough, Coton and Long Buckby. No 52: picks up in Ravensthorpe at the bus shelter and at the bottom of the West Haddon Rd at approx 9.45.

The Haddon Hopper normally runs to Rugby (Elliott's Field or town centre) on the 4th Thursday of each month departing from the village at 9.30

Buses return after approximately 2 hours.

This service is run by a social enterprise - CommMiniBus and administered by volunteers. It is free to anyone with a bus pass 8 there is a charge for anyone without a pass.
