### PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

#### TRAFFIC SURVEY

Recently we **counted traffic** coming into and out of the village at the East Haddon Rd/ West Haddon Rd junction for a few hours, and will do some more counting at different times.

This first exercise resulted in counts of 563 vehicles travelling along the East Haddon Rd, 430 along the High St, 365 along the Guilsborough Rd and 230 along the West Haddon Rd over a period of 4 hrs and 40mins. Some of these journeys will have originated in the village, others will be through traffic – but it's a significant amount of traffic for a Tuesday morning.

One of the key objectives was to get an idea of the HGV traffic. However, on this snapshot day there were only 18 larger vehicle movements recorded including the school bus and oil tankers and a large farm vehicle. It was a useful first chance to test the methodology and to get some data.

#### **POCKET PARK**

The pocket park meadow is bursting with swathes of Oxeye daisies bobbing in the breeze. Other names for the Oxeye daisy are 'moon daisy' and 'moon penny' as the bright white flowers appear to glow in the evening.
