

NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

Climate and Nature Champion

Parish Councils are being asked to nominate a **Climate and Nature Champion** who will be the Council's key point of contact and advocate for environmental sustainability, biodiversity and climate resilience. The nominee will receive regular communications and will be invited to occasional meetings. The aim is to disseminate guidance, share good practice and identify challenges and solutions.

If you have an interest in this area and have a bit of time to spare to be the champion for Ravensthorpe, please let me know, or contact me if you want to hear a bit more about it.

Traffic Survey

You may have seen a few intrepid volunteers sitting at the bottom of the West Haddon Road in May and June, with paper and pencils, recording traffic movements.

Cars, LGVs and HGVs were recorded travelling in the various directions from East to West and West to East from 7am to 1pm. We planned to come back on another day to repeat this for 1pm to 6pm. We were thwarted by the High St being closed on that day, and then began a series of road closures for pothole repairs, and for Anglian Water repairs, so the second part hasn't happened yet.

What we have got is some data! This gives us a chance to review the methodology so that what we collect is useful information. One immediate observation is that for the 6 hours we recorded on a Tuesday there were only a small number of HGVs. It may be that more travel through the village before 7am. The other figure that might surprise you, or not if you live on the High St, is that **567** traffic movements were recorded along the High St, up and down, over those 6 hours. Some of those will have originated in the village but most will be through traffic.

We would welcome input regarding data collection and analysis from anyone interested in these areas prior to the next session. Please contact me.

96 bus This bus travels regularly throughout the day between Rugby and Northampton via East Haddon. Recently the route was amended to extend to Northampton General Hospital. Given the difficulty of parking at NGH I am planning to try the bus option at some point. The route was also amended to cut out the detour round the estate off the Harlestone Rd in Northampton. It's the time of year to think about hibernation and where hedgehogs and other wildlife can fuel up before seeking shelter to overwinter. We keep all cut wood within the park, as log piles, dead hedges and wood chip paths, this provides both food in terms of beetles and bugs and hollows to sleep through the winter.

When gardening, please check for hedgehogs, especially before strimming. Consider leaving the tidying and cutting back until Spring. Dead flower heads provides shelter for ladybirds, giving you a good supply of beneficial insects for the next growing season. We, at the park, leave an area of the meadow uncut too.
