## VICAR'S EASTER MESSAGE

It is no accident that we celebrate Easter as the world (our part anyway) moves into Spring with its warmer, longer days and the promise of new life appearing all round us. The timing of it is governed both by the moon and the Spring Equinox (21<sup>st</sup> March) when the length of the day and night are more or less equal.

Easter falls on the first Sunday after the full moon after the Spring Equinox. Its roots predate Christianity. For instance, the Hot Cross Buns we eat on Good Friday (although you can usually see them in supermarkets on the first full day of shopping after Christmas – they'll be next to the Cadbury eggs) started off celebrating the Saxon fertility God: an Ox. The cross represents its crossed horns which were marked into the top of special buns. "Buns" comes from "Bouns" – the Saxon word for Sacred Ox.

Religion, politics and belief all get thrown into the melting pot of passing ages. The cross now reminds us of Christ's Cross; and the time of year, and the Easter Egg remind us of a victorious Risen Christ bringing new life to a dejected, crestfallen church.

## HORACE BATTEN - Part 4

In 1949 Horace and Eric Hickman stood and were elected as new Parish Councillors. At the time there were no street lights and few, if any, footpaths despite increasing motor traffic. At Horace's suggestion the money to pay for the first 16 street lights was raised by voluntary contributions and gradually footpaths were established.



Horace continued to run his bootmaking business at Henry Street, Northampton, until 1968/69. At that time, with a number of the workforce living in Long Buckby and with many of his hunting customers living locally, the decision was made to move production to his home in Ravensthorpe and convert the barn into the workshop that remains to this day.

The business has had many notable customers including Darth Vader from Star Wars and Madame Citroen, who flew in from Paris to Birmingham and then took a taxi to and from Ravensthorpe. When Show Jumping was the "big thing" many leading riders including Harvey Smith called as well as Nicky Caine, the daughter of Michael Caine, who at the that time was involved with a wine business in

Windsor and who provided a case of red wine. To this day there are many Army customers, including the Household Cavalry and the King's Troop, with many individuals travelling from overseas.
