LEO HIGHTON

The memories of the last remaining man in Ravensthorpe who served throughout the Second World War.

As related to the editor or compiled from his papers and contemporary notes.

Leo was born in Thurlaston, Leicestershire on the 12th June 1918; the son of a farm labourer. He attended school in the village of Earl Shilton and at the age of 16 he went to work at Eatough's shoe factory. He was called up for National Service in the Royal Artillery on the 15th July 1939, little thinking it would be six and a half years before he returned to civilian life.

He did his basic training in Norwich and was then sent to Yeovil to join the 78th Regiment RA to train for what was expected to be service in France. Around the middle of May 1940 the regiment went to Portsmouth to embark for France. However, by the time they reached the ship British forces were in full retreat and the sailing was cancelled.



The regiment remained in England to defend the country from the expected invasion. Early in 1941 they were training hard again in preparation for battle in North Africa and were attached to the 52nd Lowland Division in Scotland. During this period however, Leo found time to woo his sweetheart, Joan and they were married in Earl Shilton on the 21st June 1941.

On the 18th July 1942 the regiment left the 52nd Division and embarked on a troopship for Egypt. They arrived on the 1st September 1942 after nearly 6 weeks at sea rounding the Cape of Good Hope. ("A nice cruise", I said at this point in the interview to be met by a withering look from Leo. Clearly, it had been a

crowded, uncomfortable and boring journey.)

From this point on Leo's account is taken from the journal he wrote at the time. His job was to drive an ammunition lorry, loaded with high explosive. Often he would sit for long periods waiting for orders to move out. It was often during this time he made these notes and wrote letters home.. Comments by the editor will be in italics

. "After arrival in Egypt, and a short but intensive bout of desert training under 1st Armoured Division, I first saw action at the historic battle of Alamein." TO BE CONTINUED. (Part 2, Alamein to Tunis).

CRABTREE POCKET PARK NEWS – by Cliff Giles

By the time you receive this Newsletter the snowdrops and aconites in the lane leading from West Haddon Road (opposite Torquemeters) will probably be at their best, so if you have 5 minutes to spare why not wander up and have a look!

We have recently been able to buy a chain saw with a grant from The Big Lottery Fund (National Lottery) and Glyn Lewis has started coppicing some of the trees (assisted by Margaret Lewis and me). This will allow more light and create a more diverse habitat. The hazel trees that have been coppiced will regenerate, growing new shoots from the base. There is now a pile of twigs and branches in the pocket park that will eventually be burnt, but if anyone can make use them please help yourself. It is too late in the year to do any more coppicing now but we shall continue in the Autumn. Anyone who could help would be most welcome.

The grant also included some money to purchase plants and we intend to buy bluebells for planting in the near future. If you could help us to plant them please contact me on 770451.
