#### What should Ravensthorpe look like in future?

Daventry District Council is currently working, along with other Northants Councils, on the primary planning document for our area, the West Northants Joint Core Strategy. For more info go to the link below:

This plan will be at quite a high level, but other local plans will be developed within it. These will lay out Daventry's plans for development within the area, including the distribution of new rural housing.

All villages are being encouraged to put their views forward as part of this process, and DDC have just announced an initial consultation, to which the Parish Council will reply in general terms on behalf of Ravensthorpe.

National Government has set in place a planning climate which favours "sustainable development", and it seems that residents' views may be more likely to be taken seriously if they take account of this presumption.

Ravensthorpe's current planning status is that of a "restricted infill" village.

Ravensthorpe is lucky (thanks to the work of a number of residents) to have an existing **Village Design Statement**, finalised in January 1999, which was adopted by DDC as part of its planning policies. 14 years on, it may well be that updating this document is again the best way for the village to put its views forward.

Your opinions will count & an open meeting is being planned for the New Year, to which all residents will be invited. Please keep an eye on the Newsletter and the village website (<a href="www.ravensthorpe.me.uk">www.ravensthorpe.me.uk</a>) for further details.
