Message from Mark Battison

Some of you may be aware that 14 people from our local area have just completed a Pilgrimage to the Land of the Holy One to experience what our world was like in the time of Jesus and to start to get an understanding of what the lives of those who live there are today.

It is not possible to visit Israel and Palestine without being changed in some way. The historical, archaeological and spiritual history can be overwhelming and to know that you are actually treading the same paths that Jesus did and looking at the same views can be awesome.

At the same time we all travelled with our own perceptions of the political situation in the Middle East and our own views of how the people would greet and accept us and how they are relating to each other.

There is no getting away from the fact that the peoples of Palestine are suffering in the most horrendous of ways through the acts and intentions of the leaders of Israel and how these acts are being lived out every day. There is equally no getting away from the horrors that the Jewish people have suffered in their history which makes their current behaviour even harder to understand.

However, the overriding feeling that we experienced was one of hospitality and hope, despite the everyday situation. The Palestinian people we met showed great patience and understanding and had one desire only, to live in Peace with their neighbours and to share this land of the Holy One with all those who had a right to be there. If the peoples of this land can behave as such then surely we can also consider patience and peace to be our goals for our lives and for our communities.

At Easter we remember the wonderful message which Jesus left us, his Resurrection message, that God loves each and every one of us, equally and without condition and that we are to respond to this love by loving God back with all that we have and by loving each other equally and without condition!

Ravensthorpe Village Hall News



So much has happened to our village hall over the past 2 years and the developments continue. During the closedown last summer the kitchen was completely refitted and is now fully equipped to enable full meal preparation on-site. With the installation of an industrial dishwasher, clearing up is no longer a chore!

Development work will continue this year with plans for a complete overhaul of the toilets (including hot water), treatment to modify the hall acoustics and new shutters to the serving area and kitchen store.

Bookings at the hall continue to reach new peaks and provide a wide range of regular activities for you and your families to enjoy.

These include: Bowling, Pilates, fitness training, dance classes for children, Women's Institute and lunches for our senior citizens as well as less frequent ones such as hive making for beekeepers - quite a range!

More and more villagers are making use of the hall to hold larger family functions which is great. For those events that you want to hold at home, most of the hall equipment e.g. tables, plastic chairs, crockery and cutlery is available to hire.

Basic hall hire is only £8.00 per hour and discounted rates apply for children's parties (£25.00 for a four hour hire) and for full morning, afternoon evening or day hire.

Tables can be hired for just £2.00 each per day and plastic chairs for £0.20 each per day.
