As the nights draw in ...

As nights get darker earlier, burglary tends to increase, these tips may help protect your home.

- Leave a light on in more than one room, upstairs and downstairs remember to choose low-energy bulbs.
- Use a timer switch to operate the lights as it starts to get dark change the times that the lights come on, to create the illusion that someone is moving around inside the house
- Make sure your door is well lit and fully visible from the street.
- Keep shrubbery and hedges at the front of the house pruned to below 1m, this reduces cover for a burglar to work unseen and give your neighbours every chance to spot something suspicious
- Keep curtains closed at night if you are away, ask a neighbour to close them for you

If you are concerned about suspicious activity in your neighbourhood, ring police on 101 – in an emergency always ring 999.
