#### Message from Rev Andrew Taylor-Cook

Each one of us I am sure has a favourite Christmas Carol or Hymn that speaks to us deeply and profoundly. Whether it takes you back to your childhood or to a particular year - it's the Carol or Hymn that helps make Christmas for you. My favourite Hymn has always been: O' come, O' come, Emmanuel.......it is the hymn that starts the Christmas journey off for me. I just love to hear the beautiful haunting sound of the Choir as they sing these long awaited words. When I was in Bethlehem visiting the Church of the Nativity in January 2011, I heard those beautiful and haunting words being sung by a group of priests and people inside the Church - a sound that will stay with me for ever.

But Christmas as a whole has a new depth and meaning for me since my trip to the Holy Land, because I've actually stood where Jesus was born. Not only that, I have touched the stone-slab on the stable floor where Jesus was laid in the manger. I was there - in Bethlehem, and as close as one can possibly get to Jesus' place of birth. I can still visualize the day; the people; the building; the music; the smells and so on. I remember standing in the Shepherd's Fields too, for it is here that the shepherds were told by the Angel of God that on this day, the Messiah, a baby lying in the manger, wrapped in bands of cloth, shall be born. (Luke 2: 8-14) I have sung 'While Shepherds Watch their flocks by night', whilst standing in the Shepherd's Fields, and have also sung 'Silent Night, Holy Night' in one of the side chapels in the Church of the Nativity. Wonderful memories, that, I shall for ever cherish. Memories that are sparked off by sung foregoing Corome, O' come, Emmanuel'. All of which leads me to ask



you: what is your favourite Christmas Carol or Hymn I wonder? What memories does it provoke in you?

Whatever your plans are this Christmas, I hope and pray that you have a wonderful and peaceful time. Please look out for our Christmas Services and events across the Uplands Benefice and pop along if you can - for it would be really good to see you! Albert will be buried in his father's grave in the Ravensthorpe Churchyard.

#### Albert Watson 1931 - 2013

Albert Watson died aged 82 on 11 November after a period of prolonged ill health. He was very much a village character having lived in Ravensthorpe all his life, been born in Manor View and then living in Adnitt Row for almost all his life. Having started work aged 14 at Manor Farm he then became a Roadman later Foreman for Brixworth Council and later for the County's Highway Department.

Albert's real interest and life was as an independent Countryman. His life revolved around his ferrets, rabbits, shooting, growing vegetables and flowers and chickens. Albert was always around walking his dog up and down to the "pit" with milk and bread for his ferrets, up and down to the reservoir, around and over the local fields. His eggs were always in high demand at the Post Office as were his capons.

Albert knew everyone connected to the local countryside and could be seen every day having a chat with a passerby or working his allotment where his fresh vegetables and flowers were always in demand. In his younger days he was a keen darts player playing at the Woolpack and Chequers - until it is said he fell out with a Chequers landlord over a chicken! Whereupon his allegiance moved to the Pychley. Albert had a very independent frame of mind!


