South Northants Responder Scheme



A Community First Response (CFR) team is made up of a group of volunteers. Our team of CFR's are highly trained individuals who operate as a charity under the governance of East Midlands Ambulance Service NHS Trust.

The scheme was set up because approximately 600 people die each year unnecessarily of cardiac arrest and those who live in a rural area can expect a slower response from the Emergency Services than town dwellers.

East Midlands Ambulance Service have given the go-ahead for the South Northants First Responder scheme to be expanded with a view to a full Defibrillator Kit being located in Ravensthorpe.

This will help provide cover for East Haddon, West Haddon, Guilsborough and Spratton.

The siting of the kit in Ravensthorpe means that we will need to recruit and train two or three people in the village to attend Category A emergency calls deemed to be "Serious and/or life threatening".

Any prospective volunteers will undergo a four day intensive training and assessment with officers from the East Midlands Ambulance Service NHS Trust.

Village Broadband Survey



A big thank you for your help and taking the time to complete both the Parish and County Council's surveys.

As one of the smaller parishes by population, it is heartening to see us represented as the 6th highest number of respondents in the County Council's 'hot spots for Superfast Broadband requests' list. It will be difficult for anyone drawing up the implementation plans to ignore such an expression of desire!

From the Parish survey I was expecting to see speeds decreasing with an increase in distance from the exchange and possibly differing speeds from differing ages of village development.

However, when I plotted your readings on a map of the village, both the fastest and slowest groups of speeds were randomly spread across the village, with an average speed of just under 2Mbps.

I presented these unusual findings to the BT Director for the East Midlands who has passed them onto the management of OpenReach, but so far no comments have been returned. Hopefully we will soon have some good news on our broadband future.

Coton Manor will be opening its gates for you to see their beautiful snowdrop and hellebores between the 22nd February – 9th March 2014.

As many of you will know I have been off of work for a while due to health issues and will not be returning to the Benefice in any official capacity.
