A message from Revd Andrew

I have been receiving a lot of nuisance calls recently and what I mean by that is I have been receiving a lot of SALES calls usually from overseas.

I know at the end of the day people are simply trying to do their job but sadly it is sometimes a job that irritates people, myself included. They often ring between 12noon and 2pm, (lunchtime) or between 4pm – 6pm (teatime), why? Because they know that it is usually a good time to catch people at home. Lately they have been calling a various times, a good tactic to use of course, as it fools one into thinking that it is someone we know, therefore, more likely to answer the phone.

Sales people can be tough enough to deal with but sometimes God can be the same.

It is certainly my experience (and I know I can't be alone) that when God calls, it is not always a good time of the day or night.

The call is not always welcomed and it can be difficult to understand what God is requiring or asking. It is however important that I listen to what God is asking of me and not to simply say, "Sorry, I'm not interested please go away." Or words to that effect!

Well I can say that to God - but God has a habit of calling me back, again and again and again, until HE gets an answer.

But unlike Sales people, God is not trying to sell me things I don't want or need; He calls me out of love and calls me for a purpose. "Listen, I am standing and knocking at your door. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in and we will eat together." (Rev 3: 20)

I remember hearing God's voice at the beginning of my journey and I can remember ignoring His voice for almost three years. But God was persistent and kept calling, until one day I opened the door and allowed God into my heart, and have never looked back.

There are still occasions however when I can hear God calling me, and I do my utmost to ignore Him, just like I do with the Sales people. However, I can choose to ignore Sales people whereas when God is calling, I know it is only a matter of time before I have to give in and answer His call. **Andrew**
