What we say and what we hear

A few years ago I took a Communion Service for deaf people in Ipswich, which on the face of it seemed to have gone quite well, or so I thought. Just over a week later, I was approached by someone who informed me that one of the audience was concerned about something that I had 'signed' in the service. I was informed that I had used the term 'maybe' with regards to the body and blood of Jesus Christ within the service. At the time of the conversation I couldn't work out what I had done or where in the service I had said 'maybe'. So when I got home I reviewed the service I had delivered.

After carefully scrutinizing the service, I came to realise that I had inadvertently misinterpreted an English word, and had therefore used the wrong sign. 'Grant us therefore gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies 'may be' made clean by his body...' I had used the sign for 'maybe' meaning, perhaps. Instead of 'may be' meaning, will. Both to my horror and delight I had discovered my mistake!

I have owned up to this mistake because I want to draw your attention to what we say within our services. Do you truly know the meaning of what is spoken within a service? Do you fully understand the implications of what you say and do? Or do you simply say the words without giving it much thought because you know them so well? The next time you attend a service, think carefully about the words you are reading and saying. Who knows, you may just discover a fresh meaning and a new understanding! *Andrew Taylor Cook*


