

Introducing Revd Chris Peck, our new Vicar



I am very excited to have been appointed as Rector of the Uplands group and am looking forward to getting to know people.

I grew up on a farm in the Cotswolds so the country is in my blood. When I left school I taught in a village in Kenya before going to University in Norwich and then studying theology in London. After spending a few years training young people I started training lay people and clergy for the Church of England, which brought me to my role heading up training at the Peterborough Diocese.

I have two children from my first marriage, Antony who has a complex of learning difficulties and is in supported housing in Formby, and Nina who is currently doing a Masters at Liverpool University after teaching in Taiwan.

In 2004 I remarried and moved with Judy (a GP and ordained priest) to Grendon. To my great surprise I then received a call to ordination out of the blue in a way that I couldn't resist and spent time as a curate at Abington, Northampton (the church in the park). In any spare time I like to photograph birds, engage in five rhythms dance & walk our dog.

I am excited at seeing people grow into all God has created them to be; I have a strong conviction that we are all in this together, whether we are committed church attenders or not, and that it is together that we will enable our village communities to flourish with the churches at their heart. I long for the church to be a place where each person, whatever your circumstances, will feel welcomed; places where what happens in church will speak into your everyday life; places you can touch God and find a renewed purpose in life and hope in a troubled world.

This will take time and the building of trust as we get to know each other. I look forward to working with you as we build together on all that already happens, to develop the community life of our villages. Chris Peck


Messy Family Fun Picnics
