Keeping our Churchyard Timeless

We want the churchyard to remain beautiful and timeless and a pleasant place for all villagers and visitors to enjoy and we have had a number of questions from people wanting to know what type of memorials are suitable and appropriate in the Churchyard.

Rev Chris Peck has the final say on the style, material, and wording of any memorials, and is required to apply the Peterborough Diocese Churchyard Rules, which can be found on the Diocese website at:

Please contact Chris if you want to discuss these rules and please submit an approval form <u>BEFORE</u> commissioning any work to be done to install a new headstone or alter an existing one.

We'll be having a gentle tidy in the churchyard soon, so please remove anything you want to keep from a grave that falls outside the rules: wreaths and other cut flowers may be laid on a grave, but must be removed as soon as they appear to be withered. No artificial flowers are allowed to be laid or placed in containers except for Remembrance Day poppies and traditional Christmas wreaths.

Parking on Pavements

The Parish Council has received a number of complaints about vehicles parking on pavements within the village, and the resulting potentially very serious problems caused to pedestrians.

Pedestrians being forced to walk on the road around parked vehicles is an unnecessary risk, and those with children's buggies or mobility scooters may be particularly badly affected.

Our local police tell us that parking a vehicle on the pavement could lead to an offence of obstruction being committed, which could lead to a fixed penalty notice being issued.

The police have also advised us that, in order to avoid nuisance and danger to those on the pavement, parking vehicles should leave sufficient room on the pavement for a double buggy or wheelchair/mobility scooter to pass by without having to go on the road.

Whilst the parish council has no jurisdiction over highways within the village, we are asking for the help and support of all residents in reducing the risk of accidents.

PLEASE park your own vehicle to allow plenty of room on the pavement, and **PLEASE** ask your visitors to do the same, including delivery and repair vehicles.

We would much prefer that traffic slows down to pass parked vehicles than pedestrians having to walk in the road!
