Update On Plans For New Facilities In St Denys Church

As many of you will recall from the APCM, following questions raised earlier in the year by a number of parishioners, and also the observations of the historic societies consulted about siting a servery in the North Aisle, the PCC have been investigating the option of siting both the disabled access toilet and servery in the area currently occupied by the organ - and re-sighting an organ in an alternative position in the church. This has involved a meeting with the Diocesan Organ Advisor (who advises the Diocesan Advisory Committee on any alteration which involves moving or replacing an organ), and consultation with four organ companies about options for replacing the organ. The consensus is that the best option for St Denys would be a pipeless digital organ due to size, flexibility and suitability for the long-term and cost. Several members of the PCC went to hear a selection of such instruments played and were impressed by the sound, quality, versatility and projected longevity of these modern instruments. The PCC has received four quotes from different companies, and have canvassed the opinions of churches where they have been installed, all of which have been favourable. Before any replacement organ is purchased, the aim is to have the preferred option temporarily installed in the church for everyone to listen to. The PCC is now looking at outline plans for the re-sited servery and considering projected costs.


