Update on alterations to St Denys Church

Following objections to the proposed siting of the servery in the North Aisle, an alternative proposal was discussed at length at the wellattended annual meeting in April 2016, and the PCC was encouraged to take this forward. This was to put the servery alongside the toilet on the back wall of the church, so it would occupy the space currently occupied by the organ, which would be replaced by a digital pipeless organ, to be sited between the new servery and the bell tower. Since then members of the PCC have met with the Diocesan organ advisor who agreed with the proposal to replace the current organ, and that a digital pipeless organ would be an appropriate replacement; had extensive discussion about the design of the resited servery; carried out detailed research into alternative organs; and submitted an outline proposal to the Diocesan Advisory Committee. The outline proposal has been approved, and our architect is now drawing up detailed plans which, once approved by the PCC, will then be put up for people to view so everyone has the opportunity to see what has being proposed to the DAC.

One of the organs considered emerged as a possible front runner, and following feedback from a visit by PCC members and villagers to hear it, the PCC has decided to recommend to the DAC that a Viscount organ (Envoy S23 model) is installed as our replacement organ. The company have agreed to do a temporary installation of the organ over a weekend so everyone will have the opportunity to hear it in situ prior to installation.




Churchyard
