## Update on alterations to St Denys Church As previously communicated, revised plans for

the new facilities were submitted to the Diocese at the end of February, and the plans will be posted on the church www.uplandsgroupchurches.org.uk/ravensthorpe-st-denys and village www.ravensthorpe.me.uk/st-denys-church/ websites, and put up on the church as early in March as full size printed copies are available. Specific dates that the church will be open will be posted on the church gate noticeboard to allow anyone who wishes to view them outside service times to do so.

#### **Rev Linnet and Looking to the Future**

Sadly, at the end of October we'll be saying goodbye to Rev Linnet Smith as she retires and while she's only been with us for a couple years (and has supposedly been part time!) many of you will have seen that she has made an outstanding contribution to our churches locally, and we have been very fortunate to have her. Looking forward though, we need to work out if we can afford, as a group of 8 churches, to replace Linnet with a full time priest. Once you take into account training, housing, pensions etc., each full time priest costs us over £67,000 a year, which is a big target to reach - and to know if we can try to reach it we need every member of the congregation to carefully consider their level of giving over the next few weeks and months, and also crucially whether they could commit to regular giving by direct debit if they don't already (this allows us to plan far better). Interestingly the Church of England nationally suggests that if each adult member of our congregations gave on average (we completely understand some can't afford to give this and others can afford to give more) £16 per person per week we could meet our commitments for clergy costs quite easily - whereas currently the average member of a congregation across the country gives £10 per person per week. If you'd like to hear more about the options for the future and help us decide what to do, please join us at a special open meeting about this decision after the Group service at Thornby on 12th March - All are welcome
