#### Speakers' Corner at RVH

A small group of Ravensthorpe villagers have come together to organise talks on interesting topics in the Village Hall. The main idea is

to provide something extra for the community on top of the films, the recent play, the WI, the various classes that are offered etc. The success of recent events indicates that there is an audience of people who appreciate not having to travel too far for some stimulating entertainment. We expect to offer a wide range of topics, although history, particularly local history, does seem to be especially popular with other groups. We will see what the feedback is for the first few talks and plan accordingly.

The first Speakers Corner talk will be on April 27th on the WW 1 Prisoner of War camp that was established at Pattishall. We are lucky to have persuaded Colin Chapman, an expert on family history who has researched WW1 POW camps extensively, to come up from Gloucestershire to speak to us. This will be at 2pm. The second talk on June 8th will be at 7.30pm with Charles Aikenhead speaking on the Ghosts of Rorke's Drift The different timings are to see what is successful, or not. Speakers will talk for 1 to 1 1/2 and questions will usually be welcomed. Refreshments will be served.
