Update on the introduction of Toilet and Servery facilities at St Denys Church Ravensthorpe

The North Path disabled access is now almost complete, this means we now have step free access to the Church on a purpose built path, whereas before there was a significant step up from the footpath into the church yard along a grass path (which with the recent weather would have been a significant challenge to negotiate) and then a significant step down into the church.

The internal works have been delayed, this is due to a longer than anticipated delivery of the new stone slabs for the toilet and servery area and the new south-aisle floor. However, a significant part of the carpentry work is being completed off site, so once the new stone floor is in place, the internal works should proceed quite quickly.

We are liaising with the contractor to minimise any potential disruption to services in general and Christmas specifically. After an ongoing discussion about the best way to provide hot water for tea and coffee making in the new

servery, there was a majority vote in favour of using a wall-mounted water heater at an extraordinary meeting of the PCC.

Subsequently a Church member has offered to fully fund the wall mounted water heater for this project.

To augment the funding needed to complete the project to provide a toilet and servery and improved disabled access via the north path, the PCC has sought grant aid from various trusts. So far we have received £1,500 From the Maude Elkington Trust, £2,000 from the Beatrice Laing Trust and a pledge of £2,000 from the Northamptonshire Historic Churches Trust. We are awaiting responses from the National Churches Trust, the All Churches Trust and the Garfield Weston Trust but will not know the full results until the end of April 2020. In all we have been in contact with eight funding organisations.


