# A Message from the Rev Allison Twigg:

I hope this letter finds you well and in good spirits despite the Lockdown affecting us all, some more than others. We can pray that this dreadful virus is eventually beaten and that we can return to our more normal and sociable lives.

In the meantime, the church continues to serve our community in many ways. Although we have had to temporarily shut our buildings due to this dreadful pandemic, the church is not closed, nor has the worship ceased. We are the Church, the living body of Christ, and as such we will continue in offering to God our private prayer and worship and where it is safe we offer practical help to one another and our neighborhoods.

The ministry of the church continues, albeit in a different way. Church services have moved online with a group service at 9.30 each Sunday broadcast through Facebook Live on our Facebook Page 'Uplands Group Churches' and with video links sent by email after each service to all who wish to receive it. A service for those who do not have the Internet commences in early May, where dialing in from a land line will provide the facility to listen to a service on Tuesday mornings at 9.30. Both of these services can be accessed through our YouTube channel 'Uplands Group Churches'. A full week of services was broadcast in this way for Holy Week. There have even been online opportunities for after service coffee and fellowship!

Pastoral care carries on as we make regular calls especially to those who we know to be frail or vulnerable and those that live alone from our congregations. Pastoral care to the bereaved along with funeral ministry continues and has become more pertinent in recent weeks. The Church is still providing funeral services at the Graveside or in a Crematorium which are arranged sympathetically in liaison with the bereaved families.

Resources for Worship at Home have been distributed and regularly updated and regular prayer groups have also moved online. Learning and fellowship has continued firstly through our Lent Course which has continued as we explore together Art and The Bible Story on Wednesday evenings at 7.30, again through our Facebook page. The Church of England nationally has started a free-phone line called Daily Hope that can be called for to listen to prayers, a reflection and a selection of lively hymns each day. The number for this is 0800 804 8044.

Many of our Summer Weddings have been postponed – which means that we have a bumper wedding season booked already for 2021. So if you are thinking about a church wedding – please be in touch as soon as you can.

We have been obliged to postpone most of our Annual Parochial Church Meetings (APCM) and Annual Meeting of Parishioners (APM)] which were due earlier in the Spring to a date yet to be arranged, probably in the autumn.

Our regular Friday Uplands Group Email provides regular contact, along with details of the week's events in the Uplands Group and in the wider church.

# **CRABTREE PIT POCKET PARK**

# The Logpile House

Summer is here and the focus at the pocket park for visitors will naturally be a blooming meadow creating a buzz of bees and other insects alike. However, new additions to the park's habitat include log-piles and windrows (dead hedges) created from previous conservation work.

Deadwood, and for that matter decaying trees, actually provide a rich habitat of immense value for wildlife, such as 2,000 invertebrates in the UK, like moths, beetles, fungi etc. Deadwood also slowly releases nutrients as it decays, stores carbon and stabilises the soil.

Log-piles provide consistent conditions for sheltering amphibians likes toads, frogs and newts, as well as homes and food for overwintering hedgehogs. We ask visitors to respect our nature conservation efforts and leave all the deadwood and log-pile homes alone.
