RAVENSTHORPE AND THE LOCKDOWN ROADMAP:

On March 8—schools and colleges returned. Childcare and children's supervised activities were able to resume.

From March 29th—outdoor gatherings of two households or 6 people will be allowed (including in private gardens) Outdoor sports facilities and open-air swimming pools will be allowed to open and people will be allowed to take part in formally organised sports.

The "stay at home" rule will end, but people should continue to work from home where possible and minimise the number of journeys they make "where possible".

On April 12th, we will see the re-opening of non-essential retail. Personal care premises (e.g. hairdressers) will be allowed to re-open, as well as libraries and community centres. Hospitality venues (e.g. pubs) will be allowed to serve people outdoors, but only while seated.

Indoor mixing and visiting between different households will not be allowed, except in special circumstances (e.g. in emergencies and in the care of vulnerable people).

CRABTREE PIT POCKET PARK

Crabtree Pit Pocket Park successfully obtained from Daventry District Council an Action on Climate Change grant. Our application focuses on improving our hedgerow habitats.

We've sourced billhooks to facilitate our future learning on how to lay and coppice the hedges. This will be a more sustainable approach than using chainsaws. We'll learn how we can use our hazel coppice to provide us with stakes and binders for our hedge-laying activities. We'll be promoting the importance of hedges not just for wildlife but for a multitude of environmental and farming benefits.

We've brought a bat box and species specific saplings to support hedgerow wildlife, helping species to be more resilient in a changing climate. I'll provide more information later.

The bat box is also made from recycled plastic and recycled wood products providing a draught proof roost at a time when we're losing many tree branches in our countryside from die-back diseases. Careful buying choices helps to reduce raw materials and supports an end market for home and commercial recycling.

We look forward to informing you about our new activities funded by this grant.

PROTECTION AGAINST CRIME. BEWARE OF THE SCAMS!

I write this as a *tech amateur*, learning as I go, but like everybody else, in receipt of the regular scams. They seem to come thick and fast these days.

This week I received a text message, purporting to be Royal Mail, to tell me I need to pay £2.99 postage on a parcel waiting to be delivered. Moreover, it appeared to have been sent from a legitimate UK mobile number. We ignored it, but later we were to discover that quite a few people had been scammed into giving bank details in this way. Every week we receive calls warning us that our *internet is about to be cut off* "Please press 1" (or whatever).

I learn also that "number spoofing" is now quite easy and common these days: a way of making it look like a call or text is coming from a legitimate number but isn't. "Neighbour spoofing" is a variation on this: where fraudsters are able to use local STD codes on spoofed phone numbers. Similarly, *email spoofing* and *phishing* are also quite common: emails that appear to have been sent by people we know or legitimate businesses (such as banks), but haven't been. There is almost always a link included that we are invited to click onto, but carry viruses and worms that can have serious consequences.

There is plenty of advice online, but it can be confusing, and even understanding the terminologies can induce headache. The simple rules seem to be: be wary of any phone number that you don't recognise; don't assume that callers you don't know are who they purport to be; if you don't know the caller, just hang up; don't share any personal information with anybody you are unsure of in any way, and don't ever share passwords and PIN numbers. Banks and legitimate companies will never ask for passwords on the phone.

Similarly, emails purporting to be from people we know but look suspicious or "don't feel right" should be deleted. *Don't click onto links*. *Never update personal information or passwords through a link in an email: log on to the legitimate website manually.* And, *keep anti-virus software up to date*. If you aren't sure about this, *get advice from a trusted source*. It is really easy to feel "silly" that we don't know more than we do about these things). There are plenty of us who feel out of our depth with modern technology.

There is a lot of very good advice about avoiding scams and keeping your financial affairs safe on various websites, such as Citizen's Advice, and the Financial Conduct Authority.

In relation to crime more generally, Neighbourhood Watch is launching a social campaign on March 31st which is aimed at making people more aware of car crime in the UK, which continues to be a major problem. The messages underlining this are: always lock your car; don't leave belongings in it and certainly not where they can be seen; and wherever possible leave your car in a place where it is lit.

We are encouraged to visit the Neighbourhood Watch website: www.ourwatch.org.uk to find out more. In Ravensthorpe, our Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator is Glyn Lewis. Glyn regularly circulates updates on local crime and action, which many of us receive and find very helpful. If you want to receive these then you can email Glyn at glynlewisuk@yahoo.co.uk and he will add you to his circulation list.

If you are concerned and wish to report a about a scam (or a possible scam), you can phone 101, or send an email to Glyn and he will pass it on. If ever you feel in immediate danger, telephone 999.
