FOOD BANKS: "A SHOCKING FACT"

"I heard a shocking fact on the radio on Wednesday morning (last week) that I couldn't quite believe and I have been pondering ever since. There are more Foodbanks now in the UK than McDonald's fast-food Restaurants. Through the power of Google it didn't take long to discover that this fact is true and has been true since 2019. Although we don't have a McDonald's in any of our villages- you don't need to travel far to find one! There are six branches of McDonald's in Northampton. One in Daventry and four on the M1 between the two. The news this week has been full of news of increasing fuel bills leading to fuel poverty and rising food prices, and many find themselves confronted with a need to consider whether to heat or eat. The need for foodbanks is likely to grow further.

"For much of this church year we read Luke's gospel, often known as the Gospel of the poor and hear the challenging messages that are there. Those of us that have faith that God is with us are called to worship together regularly and to act, following God's desires to bring in his kingdom through us today.

"I will be food shopping later today. I am going to grab a few extra items and donate them to the food bank, if you are able to, could you do this too?"

The Committee will, as ever, need to rely on the help of the village and volunteers around specific events. Another Beer Festival day is being planned for July, subject to the usual (C19) "factors".

We are also planning to continue in 2022 to develop and improve the Playing Field and Children's Play Area resources All subject to funding, of course. But please keep supporting our lottery and our events, as you have.

SAFEGUARDING

The Playing Field Committee is committed to ensuring the welfare of children and vulnerable adults both in relation to the use of the Playing Field and its resources. We can only do this in the most effective way with the support of the village community as a whole.

It is not a "public park" and receives no external funding. It is a private park which belongs to the villagers of the parish, and is a registered charity—no. 000133. The Playing Field Committee is delegated to manage its resources on behalf of the village by its trustees, the Parish Council. Members of the Committee are volunteers from within the Parish.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTICE PROBLEMS WITH DOG FOULING IN THE VILLAGE

It has been brought to the Council's attention that there have been recent and repeated instances of dog fouling on pavements and also on residents' private property within the village that is not being cleared up by the dog owners. This is clearly totally unacceptable.
